BEAH in 2013

Happy New Year, providers!

Breathe Easy received the highest number of referrals ever -245 in 2013! Thank you so much! Most of our referrals usually come from Dorchester and Roxbury but this year, we noticed that there have been an increase of referrals from the East Boston neighborhood of Boston. This is great news as Breathe Easy's target populations are families with asthma in Boston's neighborhoods with lots of multi-family rental housing. We're so please to be receiving referrals for residents of East Boston.

As we reviewed program data for 2013, we observed that again this year inspectors have trouble getting into a fair amount of Breathe Easy referrals for both inspections and re-inspections. The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation public health research grant that Breathe Easy at Home received in 2013 will provide an opportunity to learn more about the causes of this problem and to identify potential ways to address this problem.

During the January 2014 meeting of the Breathe Easy at Home Steering Committee, case reviews showed a few BEAH clients whose landlords threatened or conducted retaliatory actions. Plans to educate property owners in Boston will target this problem. The Office of Civil Rights has offered to conduct initial investigations of these situations, so please inform us if this is a problem or concern of your patients.

Financial Resources for Patients Who Are Owners

If your patient with asthma owns their home, they may be reluctant to have an inspection by the Inspectional Services Department. The Department of Neighborhood Development's (DND) Boston Home Center HomeWorks HELP program provides interest free loans for home repair. Home Center staff assess homeowners' eligibility to receive an interest-free loan for a variety of approved home repair projects. The program helps owners through the entire home repair process, helping to find a contractor, monitor work quality, and ensure a post-renovation inspection. This may be a resource for addressing housing conditions, in owner occupied homes, that affect asthma.

The Boston Home Center also offers a program for owners of triple-decker units called, **3D HELP** through which owners may be eligible to receive up to \$30,000 in home repair or energy retrofits funding from the City.
